Notes on the Notes:

Today's postlude, the first movement of Rheinberger's "Magnificat" Sonata, felt especially appropriate for today's service, given that the Magnificat—when Mary exclaims her praise for the Lord—is today's Gospel reading. The German composer Rheinberger based his sonata on a Gregorian chant tone called "tonus peregrinus" (English: wandering tone). In Lutheranism, this chant tone is associated with the Magnificat, since Luther's German translation of the Magnificat was traditionally set to it. This earns the sonata its name and makes it a favorite of the Advent season in Germany, especially on this particular Sunday!






