Notes on the Notes

Twentieth-century French composer Maurice Duruflé composed the variations on "Veni Creator" (Come, Holy Ghost) in 1930, based on the chant sequence for the feast day of Pentecost. This piece consists of a theme and four variations, which traditionally would have been played in alternation with the sung chant. Until the twentiethcentury, the organ was not used as an instrument to accompany singing in the French mass. Instead, the choir and organ were two very distinct entities. The choir chanted a verse of text, the organist improvised on the second verse, the choir chanted the third verse, and so on. Today, it is normal practice for organists to play these variations as a solo organ work without chant, but it is enriching to imagine how this piece would have been performed originally.


