

Did You Know

This past week, members from St. Philip the Deacon contributed 435 hours of volunteer service helping to build a new home in Bloomington at our 10th Annual Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity Build. Fifteen volunteers per day installed exterior insulation board and sheathing. They built benches and set-up scaffolding. They helped build an ADU (Accessory Dwelling Unit) and two-stall garage. Volunteers measured, measured again, cut, hammered, nailed, drove screws, leveled, plumbed and snapped chalk-lines. They worked together, ate lunch together (provided by church volunteers), visited, laughed, and enjoyed the gift of fellowship and reaching out in love to our neighbor. It was a wonderful, faith-filled week. Thanks to everyone who helped to support this important event for Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity.
