Did You Know

This coming Tuesday, January 6, is the festival of Epiphany ("manifestation"), which comes 12 days after Christmas. Anticipating that festival, we celebrate Epiphany in our worship this weekend. Epiphany commemorates the visit of the Magi, an event which represents God's glory revealed to all nations through the person of Jesus Christ. Like the light of the star that guided the wise men to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God claimed in baptism and sent out to share the good news of God's love to all people.
